

Lesson Review

Review the Bible truths from this lesson by covering the following:

- The first and most important purpose of human beings is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.
- The word *glorify* means *to give honor and admiration*.
- The word *praise* means *to express how great someone or something is*.
- *Worship* means *to show great respect, honor, and devotion*.
- People should glorify God by praising Him for who He is and thanking Him for what He has done.
- Psalm 50:23 says to glorify God through praise and worship or by sacrificing thank offerings.
- Believers can praise and worship God through words and music.
- God should be praised through words and music both in private and in public.
- God is not glorified when someone worships Him in such a way as to bring attention to himself or herself.
- People are to worship God in spirit and truth.
- *In spirit* means *from the heart*—with gratitude, praise, and an honest desire to glorify God.
- *In truth* refers to *keeping in accordance with God's Word*. God must be worshipped out of a correct understanding of who He is.
- Christians should offer every moment of life to God as worship.
- Believers are to offer their body as a living sacrifice.
- To be a living sacrifice, one must deny selfish and ungodly desires and behaviors, and honor God with the right thoughts, words, and actions.
- Christians should live their life in such a way as to glorify God.
- Christians are supposed to do everything with all their heart for the Lord.
- Living for God and living to help others is being a servant. Serving God by helping or serving others brings glory to Him.
- Using the gifts God gives and talking to others about His Son are ways to bring glory to God.
- Believers can glorify God in the midst of suffering, persecution, and even death.
- When Christians are suffering for the sake of Christ, they should be patient and keep a positive attitude toward God.
- Paul and Silas responded to their suffering in prison with prayer and by singing hymns to God.
