

Lesson Review

Review the Bible truths from this lesson by covering the following:

- Temptation is an invitation to do wrong. Satan disguised himself as a serpent and tempted Eve to disobey God.
- Adam and Eve both disobeyed God. Their sin affected all people after them.
- The sin nature is the inherited tendency to sin. All people have been born with a sin nature. People sin because they are sinners.
- The first sin is called *the Fall*. God's righteous judgment of sin resulted in serious consequences not only for Adam and Eve but for all people.
- The consequences for sin include physical death and spiritual separation from God forever.
- Sin is not only breaking God's law but also failing to do the good that one knows he or she should do.
- People miss the mark of God's perfect holiness when they sin, and all people have missed that mark and sinned.
- People sin against God in their thoughts, in their words, and in their actions.
- Tempting thoughts often lead to sinful words or sinful acts.
- People often rationalize their sin by saying that something sinful is really okay.
- People who say that they are not sinful are only lying to themselves. Even committing one sin makes a person guilty before God.
- People are powerless to do anything on their own to be brought into a relationship with God.
- God made a way for people to be forgiven for their sins and restored into a relationship with Him. Having a strong relationship with God through prayer, Bible reading, and fellowship with other believers makes it easier to not give in to temptations.
- The way that people receive God's forgiveness is by accepting Jesus as Savior and placing their trust in Him.
- Christians will continue to struggle with temptation and their sin nature all their life, but they experience God's forgiveness by confessing and repenting of their sin.
